

Dr Karim Kahn

Karim Khan will make his 6th visit to South African for the 2011 SASMA conference. He is an Australian-trained sports medicine physician (MBBS 1984) and he earned a PhD for research that contributed to changing clinicians' approach to treating tendinopathy (1998). He has also published extensively in bone health – both in stress fractures and in exercise prescription across the lifespan to prevent osteoporotic fracture in later life.

Karim is probably best known as one half of the 'Brukner and Khan' textbook authorship team; *Clinical Sports Medicine* is a gold standard in South Africa and a global bestseller. Karim has been editor of the BJSM, British Journal of Sports Medicine, since 2008 and he has worked with the senior editorial team to make this journal particularly relevant for clinicians who are actively engaged in sport and exercise medicine.



Applications are being sought for a postdoctoral position in the School of Physiology's Exercise Laboratory, University of the Witwatersrand, Johannesburg, South Africa. The successful candidate will be involved in a project investigating the effects of physical activity (or inactivity) on obesity, arterial stiffness and metabolic syndrome in South African children. Research experience in one or more of the following areas will be an advantage: exercise physiology, cardiovascular physiology, metabolic syndrome, diabetes and obesity. Please note that the position is dependent on the School of Physiology securing funding for the position, which will be for one year in the first instance, with the possibility of renewal.
