Benefits of SASMA membership

BJSM* and SASMA

BJSM has been SASMA's international sports and exercise medicine (SEM) journal partner for over 10 years. SASMA is one of 25 international member societies associated with BJSM. Significantly, one of the benefits of SASMA membership (currently R1 100 per annum per individual) is free electronic access to BJSM (www.bjism.bmj.com). Remarkably, this benefit **in itself is worth R3 800 per year** the annual fee for BJSM access.

BJSM is, by some distance, the SEM journal with the largest reach and best reputation in the field. SEM articles published in BJSM are likely to be widely read and repeatedly cited. Its Impact Factor (a scientometric index that reflects the yearly average number of citations that recent articles published in a given journal received) is 11.645. The next highest for a SEM journal is Sports Medicine at 7.583.

The format of BJSM makes for interesting and relevant reading for all in the field. Each of the 24 annual editions consists of carefully selected editorials by leaders in the field, review articles, original research, an infographic aimed at crystallising key learning issues on a specific topic, SEM highlights from other journals and a feature on unpublished research by an up-and-coming researcher.

But wait, there's more....!

Electronic access to BJSM allows members to listen to regular podcasts featuring key opinion leaders (See (<http://feeds.bmj.com/bjism/podcasts> 1.5 million listens mostly in the traffic!), while the BJSM clinical YouTube series (<https://www.youtube.com/BJSMVideos>) has over 6.5 million views. Interested in specific areas? Then sign up for the "email alerts" and you will be prompted by email when relevant papers are first published online. Simply click on the link <https://bjism.bmj.com/alerts> and enhance your knowledge....

All these benefits make a SASMA membership the cheapest way to access this premier SEM journal and, apart from the other benefits of being a SASMA member, make the membership fee most worthwhile.


BJSM South African Edition

Exercise is Medicine (EIM) is a global initiative to establish activity as a standard in healthcare.

The vision is to make physical activity assessment and promotion a standard in clinical care, connecting healthcare with evidence-based resources for people everywhere and of all abilities. EIM South Africa was established in 2013. The EIM (SA) accreditation courses are aimed at increasing knowledge of health care providers and health and fitness professionals regarding exercise assessment and prescription across the spectrum.

Focus projects for the year include:

- Inclusion of physical activity in the undergraduate medical curriculum (has started at Wits in 2019).
- Training of health care and fitness professionals in the EIM (SA) accredited courses. The accreditation taking on a new methodology of modules that can be done separately and accumulate towards accreditation.
- The implementation of “EIM – on Campus” as an initiative on education on campuses across SA.
- The establishment of a registry of EIM (SA) accredited professionals which can be used by healthcare providers as a referral platform.


