#### SAIDS

On behalf of SASMA, Jon Patricios and I have been working closely with the South African Institute for Drug Free Sport on a number of issues. The most exciting is the development of an anabolic steroids testing programme at schools. This initiative has taken a while to implement mainly due to conflicts between the WADA Code and the South African Schools Act. However, these have now been resolved and WADA has provided SAIDS with certain dispensations to its Code to allow testing to proceed in this country's schools. As I write this, workshops are being held around the country with various headmasters as a final step to implementation.

On a similar note, we believe that pupils should not be encouraged to take sports supplements, but should rather focus on improving their diet. SAIDS will be loading a list of SASMA accredited dieticians onto their website to encourage parents to make use of these medical professionals, rather than turning to the perceived quick fix of supplements.

Likewise, SAIDS would like to promote the services of SASMA accredited sports physicians for the issuing of TUE's to elite sports men and women. I will be forwarding a list of SASMA accredited doctors to SAIDS as well. Should you be accredited and object for some reason to your name and contact details being displayed on the website, please let me know.


